What is love actually like?

READ

4 Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. **5** It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. **6** Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. **7** It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. 1 Cor. 13:4-7

RESPOND

- 1. Would you describe yourself as patient or pushy when it comes to those you love?
- 2. Pastor Kyle shared that unkindness is weakness. What do you think it might look like in your own life to "loan someone kindness" in order to help them feel stronger?
- 3. Jesus emptied himself and became a servant and promoted the wellbeing of others over himself. What is one thing you could change to honor or elevate your spouse, or children, or people close to you and "let them shine"?
- 4. Do you struggle with boasting or envy? Why do you think this verse means: "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves" (Phil. 2:3).

DO THE STUFF: When You Can't Seem to Love Others Like You Want To

Say these words: Jesus, thank you for being the perfect picture of love. Help me learn from you.

Think this thought: When I celebrate and honor others, I am operating from the love I have been given.

Pray this verse or pick your own promise to memorize: *Lord, help me to value others above myself. Reveal areas where I am being selfish or conceited so I can love others like you love me.*

PRAY

Before you close your time together, open up a time of "celebrating" each other. Everyone should take a few minutes to honor and shine the spotlight on someone in their group. Then pray those very things over each other.
