#### READ OUTLOUD FOR A RECAP

#### **WHAT JESUS SAYS:**

- Belief in me is important, but an inactive faith isn't one I can lead away from temptation. (John 3:16, Matt. 16:24)
- I understand temptation, I have been there. (Heb. 4:15)

#### WHAT HE DOESN'T SAY:

- Sin now, ask for forgiveness later. (Rom. 6:15-16)
- You can manipulate God through prayer or dismiss his commands all together and do what you want.
- Tempation is not dangerous.

## **CONSIDER THIS**

"The opposite of temptation is love." - Pastor Kyle

Following Jesus leads us away from temptation because he is always leading us into deeper love for the Father and others.

- Religion promises that if you don't sin, you will be worthy.
- Evil takes you deep into the darkness of life and leaves you there for dead.
- Relationship promises if you follow Jesus, you will find that the purpose of life is on the other side of you.
- Grace pierces that very same darkness and leads you out of it.

# **DIG DEEPER**

#### Read John 3:16 and John 3:20-21

 The most famous verse in the Bible doesn't end with belief in verse 16, but instead goes on to say that those who follow Jesus have forward momentum in their lives toward the light of truth.

Everyone who does evil hates the light, and will not come into the light for fear that their deeds will be exposed. But whoever lives by the truth comes into the light, so that it may be seen plainly that what they have done has been done in the sight of God. (NIV).

- What does Jesus promise if we bring our sin into the light? Read the very next verse **John: 3:22**


22 After this, Jesus and his disciples went out into the Judean countryside, where he spent some time with them.

- 2. Pay attention to the first thing that comes to mind.
- 3. Read 1 Thessalonians 3:3-4 over yourself in response: "But the Lord is faithful. He will establish you and guard you against the evil one. (2 Th 3:3-4).
- 4. Thank God for being your deliverer.
- 5. Repeat as necessary.
