#### READ OUTLOUD FOR A RECAP

#### WHAT JESUS SEES:

- He sees those in need and asks what he can do for them; followers of Jesus ask for their sight to be restored. (Luke 18:40,41)
- He sees past the things that trip us up most (wealth, theology, prejudice) Luke 18:34

#### WHAT HE DOESN'T SEE:

- He doesn't see our needs or areas of weakness as unsolvable flaws ( 2 Cor. 12:9).
- He doesn't see our money, our doctrine, or our ideals as central to the call to follow him.

### **CONSIDER THIS**

"'I don't know' is the must humble way to pray." - Pastor Kyle

Following Jesus means asking to see things we can't on our own—not so we can be more right or more well-off—but to keep us close to the heart of a God who teaches the teachable.

- Religion promises that money is a sign of God's blessing, theology is more important than relationships, and that your prejudice keeps you safe from people unlike you.
- Relationship promises that generosity is a sign of God's power in your life. good theology will come when surrounded by those you're called to love, and prejudice has no place in a kingdom made for outsiders and the lost.

## **DIG DEEPER**

#### Read Luke 18:31-34

- In context, this section of scripture is about Jesus foretelling his death to his disciples. But his disciples could not "see" what was coming.
- The kind of kingdom Jesus was coming to build made no sense to them because they were looking for a political one that overthrew the Roman government.
- The disciples wanted immediate results from Jesus instead of a long-term plan for salvation that would effect humankind for millennia to come.
- Why do you think the disciples couldn't understand what Jesus was trying to tell them?
- Do you think it's common for God to bring about his purposes in ways that are much different than we expect?
- How might this inform what we hope to "see" as a result of our prayers?



# Let's Grow Up.

Whose kingdom are you building?

Pastor Kyle challenged us with these next steps:

- 1. **Choose** to identify the blocker of sight in your life.
- 2. Acknowledge like Bartimaeus that you are blind and in need of restoration.
- 3. **Declare** that you want to see, so you can be free.

#### **The Bartimaeus Prayer**

Jesus stopped and ordered the man to be brought to him. When he came near, Jesus asked him, What do you want me to do for you?""Lord, I want to see," he replied.

- 1. Ask Jesus to come near.
- 2. Believe that he is asking you how he can help.
- 3. Ask him to increase your desire for the kind of sight he gives.
- 4. Stay alert to the ways your sight begins to change and what he draws your attention to.
