

# Where the story begins

## LEARN

### read outloud

"Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see. This is what the ancients were commended for. By faith, we understand that the universe was formed at God's command, so what is seen was not made out of what was visible." (Heb 11:1–3.)

- God puts so much more emphasis on the depth of one's faith (confidence in what we do not see) than on a person's clean track record. What stands out to you in this passage?
- Faith isn't just belief; it's also an action.

"In the same way, was not even Rahab the prostitute considered righteous for what she did when she gave lodging to the spies and sent them off in a different direction? As the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without deeds is dead." (James 2:25-26)

### Talk about it.

God keeps his promises to us no matter what we do or don't do. However, faith isn't static. We can't follow Jesus by standing in one place.

What do you think active faith looks like? (Read Heb. 11 for examples)

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What you'll need:

- a chair
- a willing volunteer
- faith

Put a chair in the middle of the room. Ask the room if they think that chair can hold the person about to sit in it. Before they do, ask:

- How do you know this chair will hold \_\_\_\_\_'s body weight?
- What would cause you to doubt that it could?

Have someone sit in the chair. Then, remove the chair from sight, and ask:

- Can that chair still hold a person's body weight even though you can't see it?
- If you could see God, would you believe in Him more or less than you do right now?

## PRACTICE RE-LABELING

Rahab was labeled "Rahab the Prostitute," and Matthew? "Matthew, the tax collector."

- What label or labels have you had in your life?
  Good and not so good? What would you prefer to be labeled or called instead?
- What label has God given you? (Read 2 Cor. 6:18)
